Young people gamble for some of the same reasons that adults do. Studies show 2-7% of children experience a gambling addiction, compared to about 1% of adults. Before you buy lottery tickets as stocking stuffers, think about what risks they may pose for your children.

Q: What services are available for my adolescent?

A: In April 2016, a mutual decision was made when Francis Lauer merged with Youth and Shelter Services (YSS) to no longer offer adolescent assessments and counseling services at Prairie Ridge in Mason City, IA. YSS specializes in adolescent treatment, so we felt their expertise would be a better fit for the community of Mason City. The Mason City office still handles all adolescent prevention education, such as Diversion and Adolescent PRI for all outreach offices. Our outreach offices in Algona, Charles City, Forest City, and Hampton still offer adolescent assessments and counseling services.

We know these changes can be quite confusing. Hopefully this will clarify any misunderstandings for our community partners!


Santa's Secret
